

How diving scores are calculated

Seven judges' scores are used. The highest two and lowest two scores are thrown out, leaving the three middle scores. The three middle scores are summed and multiplied by the dive's degree of difficulty to get the total score for that dive.

Add up the diver's scores for every dive. All dives are counted

For example:
